Motion was made by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Dymond to waive the reading of the minutes of the March 3, 2016 Regular Meeting, and to accept the minutes as posted. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Melvin gave the Treasurers report reciting the combined balances for all funds as of March 31, 2016 totaled \$518,231.11. Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Miller to approve the March 2016 Treasurers report, to approve payment of expenses totaling \$16,724.06 and to approve payrolls and payroll taxes in the amount of \$10,424.55. CORRESPONDENCE AND COMMUNICATIONS

Franklin Township Fire Department report was provided by Bob Kile Sr. Franklin & Northmoreland Township Ambulance Report for the first quarter of 2016 was recited by Mr. Melvin. A letter was received from Luzerne County Solid Waste Management Department regarding the 2016 paper shredding recycling program. Another letter from Luzerne County Solid Waste Management Department about discussing ways to change current legislation to restart and make viable electronics recycling in the county.

- 1. A motion was made by Mr. Dymond, seconded by Mr. Williams to approve and sign a Cooperation agreement with the other municipalities in the Back Mountain Community Partnership for the use, and maintenance of the new Vactor Truck to be delivered this summer.
- 2. Mr. Dymond spoke about the Planning Commission review submitted by the Secretary.
- 3. Mr. Melvin spoke about adopting a property maintenance code for the township. Enforcing property maintenance issues would be strengthened by adopting a code especially if such enforcement requires issuing citations and appearing in court.

- 5. Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dymond to update the Franklin Township fire box alarms, specifically that Franklin Township Fire Department will be called for structure fires only The motion passed unanimously.
